Advice and support for individuals receiving a concern or allegation

If you have personally received a concern from a child or adult you may wish to speak with someone confidentially to help you deal with what you have heard. You may also feel the need to be reassured that the issues are being dealt with in the best possible way with the interests of the child or young person being paramount.

You will be able to discuss the disclosure with the Club Welfare Officer or the British Rowing Child Protection Officer, and they will be able to keep you informed of the case and its progress. However, you may wish to speak to someone outside of the rowing environment.

Clearly confidentiality is essential and therefore when seeking support or guidance from a recommended source as detailed below you will be expected to keep the personal details (names of individuals concerned, location etc) confidential.
